Mark Holzberg brings nearly a half century of clinical, research, and administrative experience to The ChildTrauma Academy. After spending nearly 25 years in the field of Developmental Disabilities and Special Education at the Developmental Institute at Michael Reese Hospital and Medical Center in Chicago, Dr. Holzberg was asked to join the Division of Clinical Services of the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services where he served in a variety of clinical and administrative capacities. Working with

clinicians across Illinois, Dr. Holzberg led efforts to develop and implement a statewide clinical consultation program available to all case workers, the development of a front-end behavioral health screening and assessment process for all clients entering the child welfare system, and the development of a state wide credentialing process for treatment providers to insure they provide trauma informed intervention services.

Currently Dr. Holzberg is an Assistant Research Professor at the Department of Psychiatry at the Feinberg School of Medicine at Northwestern University where he continues to be involved clinical program development and research activities that are focused on the broader child welfare system.

Dr. Holzberg holds a doctorate in Educational and Clinical Psychology from Northwestern University and a Master's in Public Health in Community Health Sciences from the University of Illinois-Chicago.
