



Roland Verdouw, MD

Dr. Roland Verdouw is a Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist working and living in Amsterdam, the Netherlands. Dr. Verdouw received his medical degree from the University of Amsterdam in 2006, his training and post-graduate work having focused heavily on child maltreatment and its long-term effects. Dr. Verdouw completed a residency in general psychiatry at GGZ InGeest and a fellowship in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry at de Bascule, Academic Center for Child and Adolescent Psychiatry in Amsterdam.

Dr. Verdouw became a Robin Fancourt Memorial Scholar with The ChildTrauma Academy in 2013, and he is currently completing the Mentor Phase of NMT Training Certification. Since 2016, he has worked in a team implementing the Neurosequential Model of Therapeutics (NMT) in an outpatient setting. He also teaches about the Neurosequential Model principles and has given several lectures at national and international conferences about this new approach for clinical problem solving. Together with clinicians in Europe he is creating a network to build a working community to share experiences and opportunities and to learn from each other.
